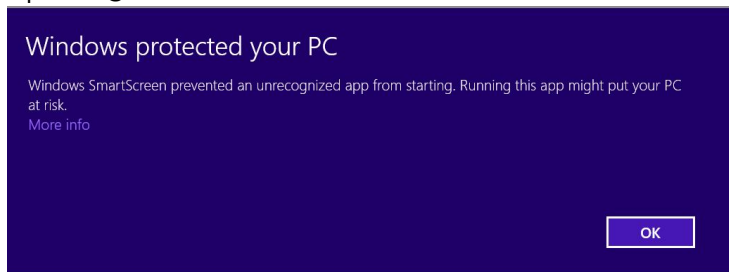


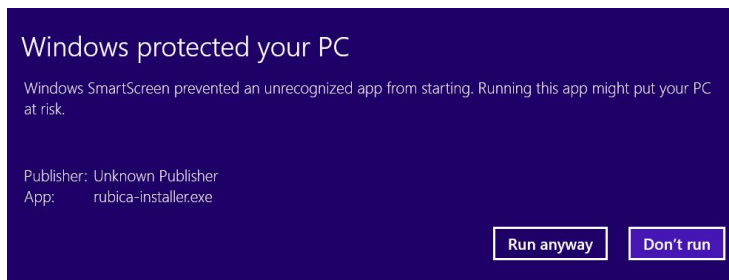
## Installing Rubica on Windows.

Download the Rubica installer for Windows.

Some versions of Windows will have “Smart Screen” enabled. This will block the opening of the installer.

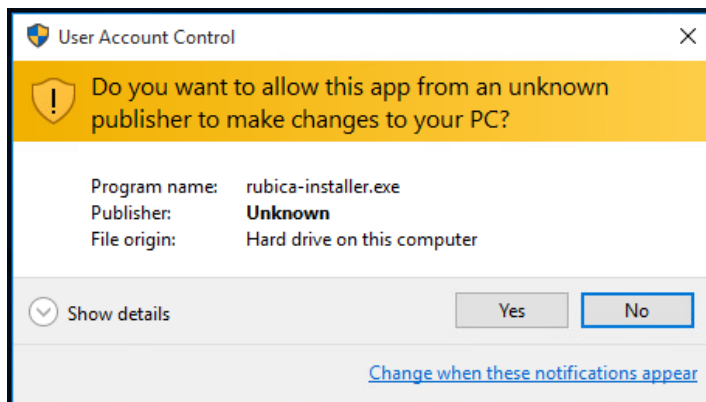


Click “More info”

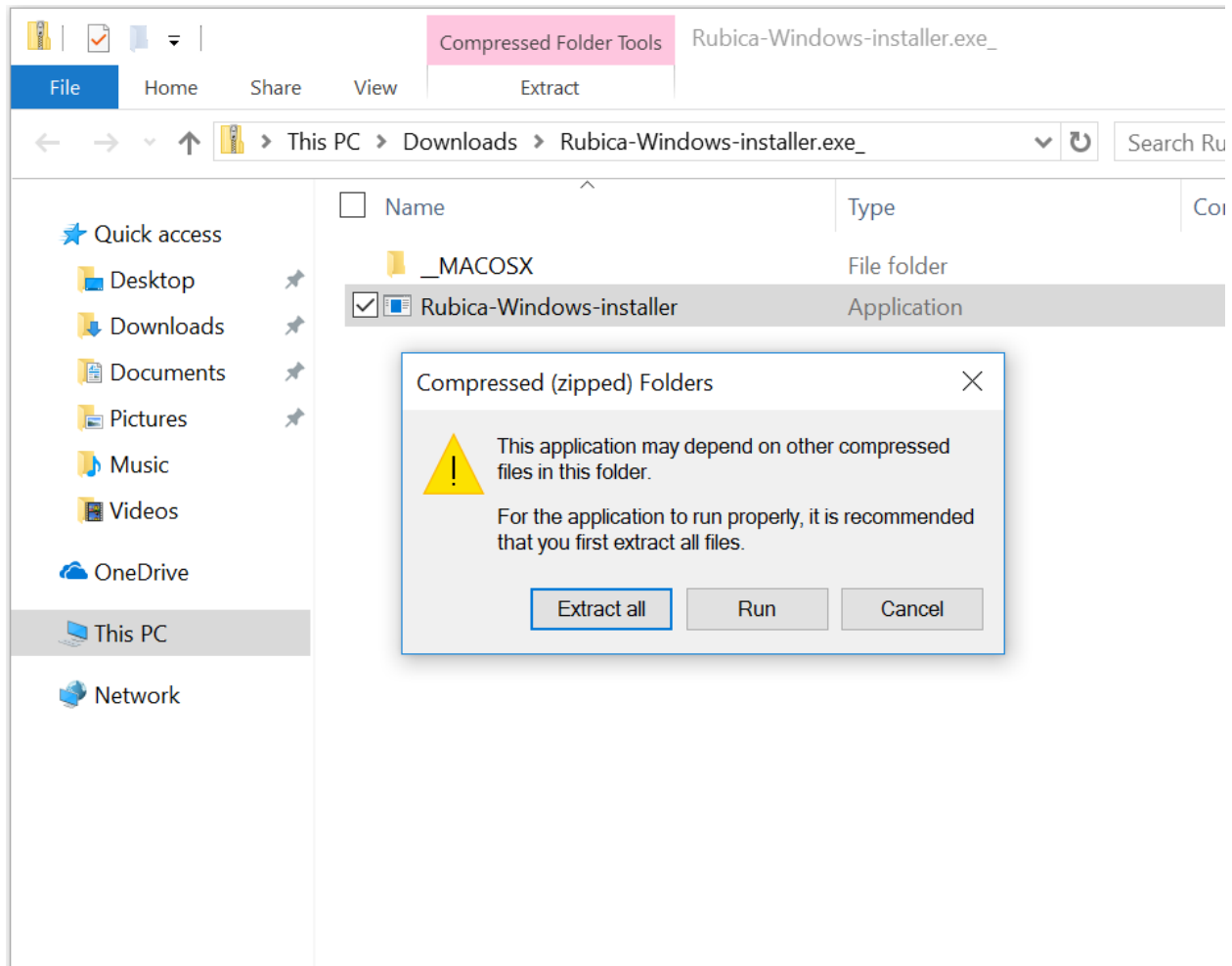


Click “Run anyway”

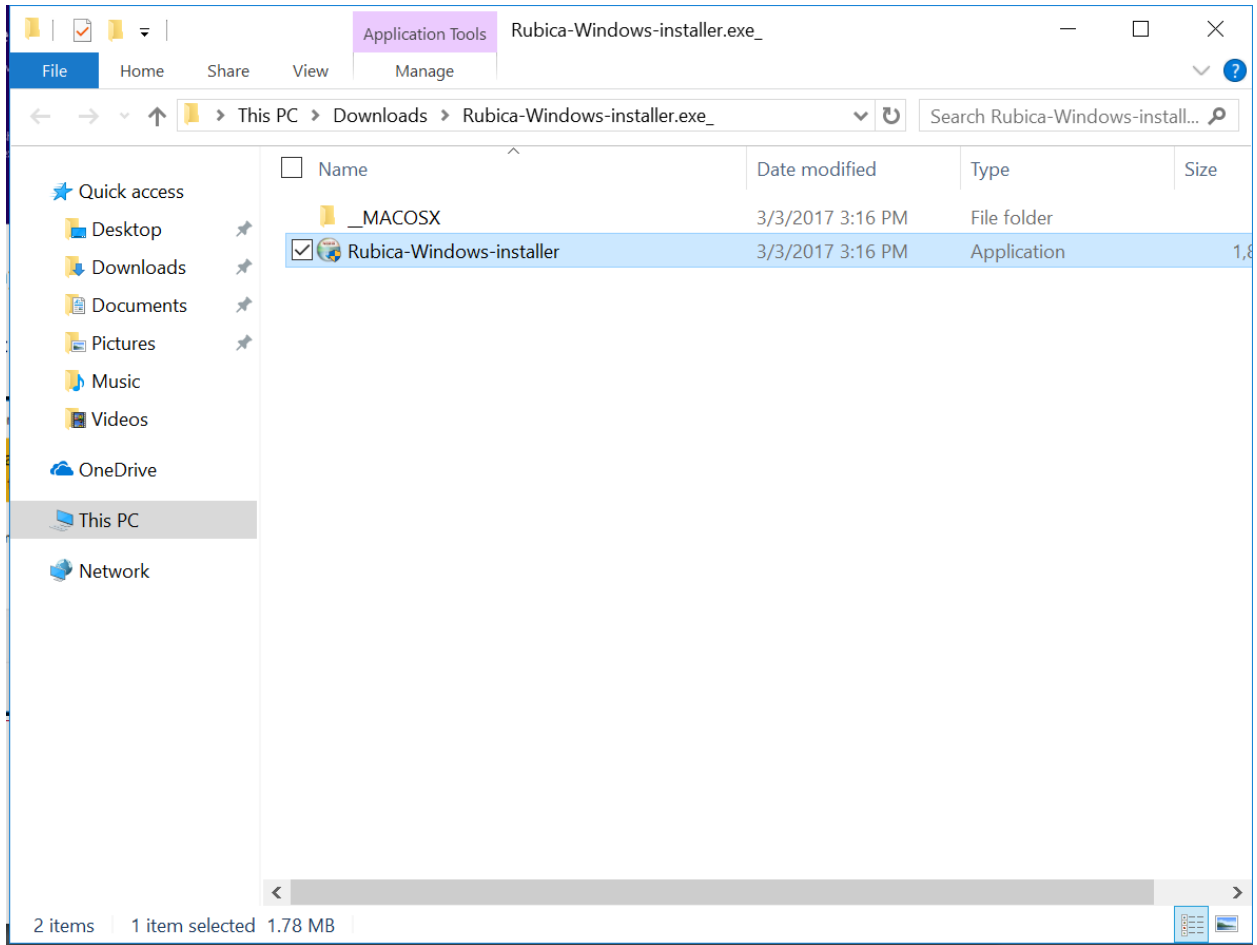
User Account Control might ask for permission to open the file:  
Click “Yes”.



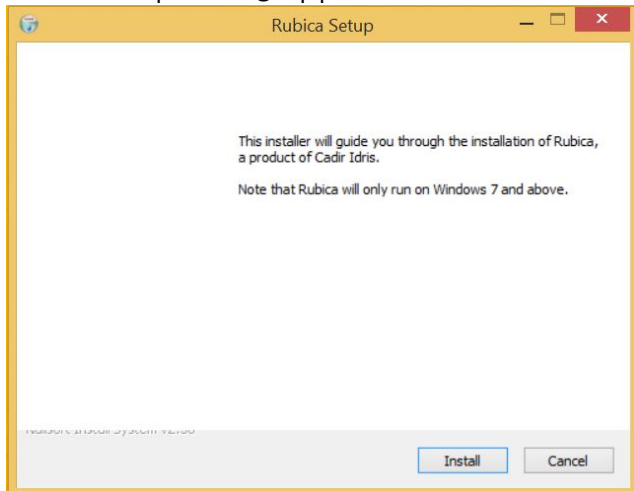
This will initiate the download of the Rubica Installer zip file. When Download is complete, click the file in your browser and select 'Extract All' in the dialog and make a note of the Install location (it will likely default to the 'Downloads' folder where the zip was downloaded to:

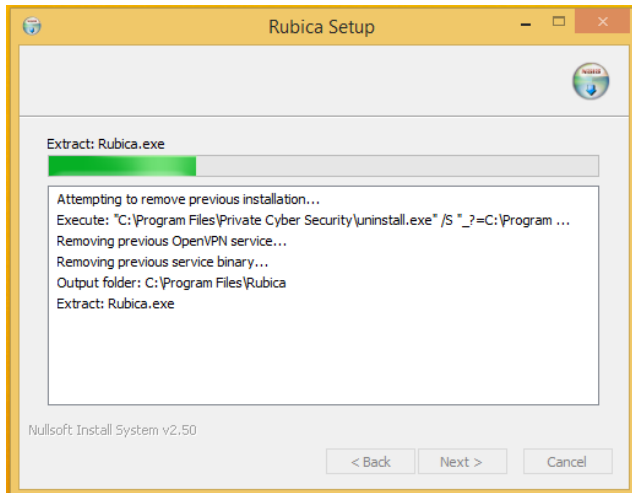


After extracting the package, double-click on the Rubica Installer:



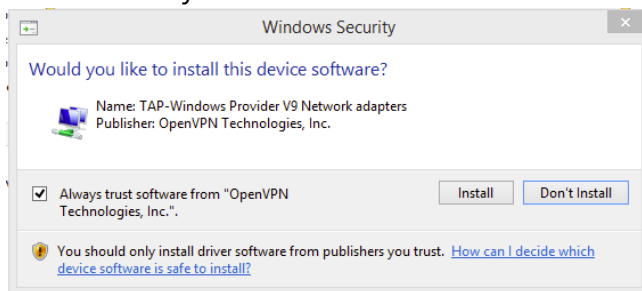
Initial Setup dialog appears. Click "Install".





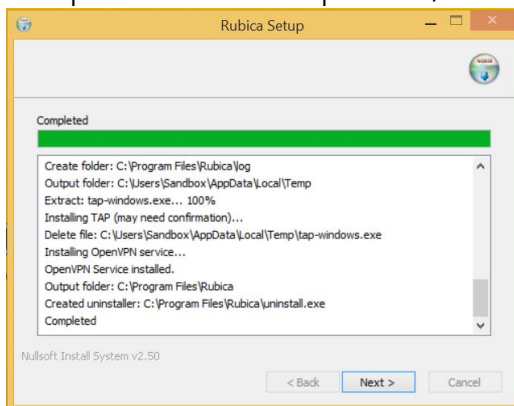
The installation progress bar is shown... and Windows may ask for confirmation to install TAP (OpenVPN software)

If you do not get prompted to install TAP, that likely means you already have the software on your PC which is fine. You'll see the screen below.

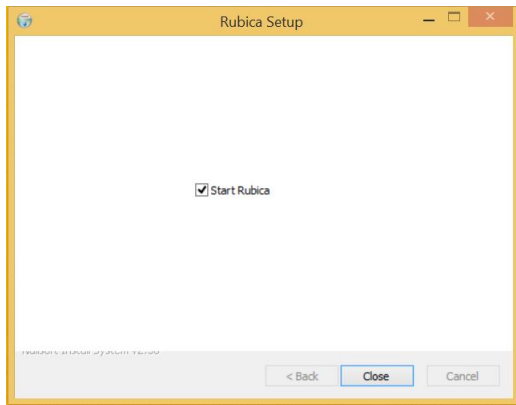


Click "Install" on the Windows Security check for TAP-Windows Provider...

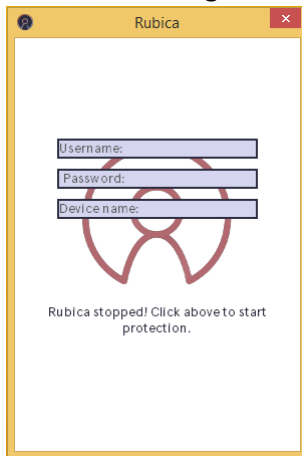
Setup will show "Completed", click "Next".



leave the box checked for "Start Rubica" and click "Close".

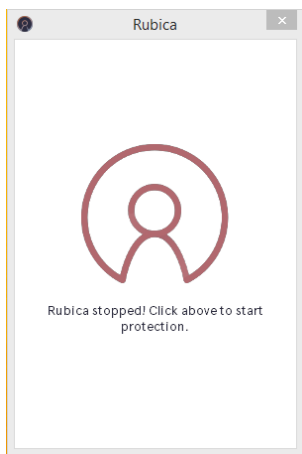


The Rubica registration window will appear.

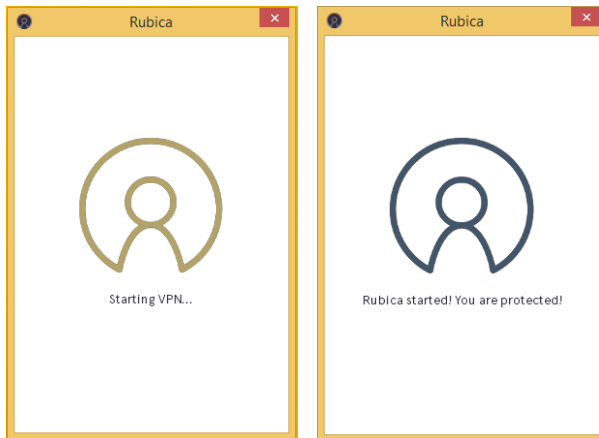


Enter your user name and password, and create a device name (friendly computer name) and click "Login".

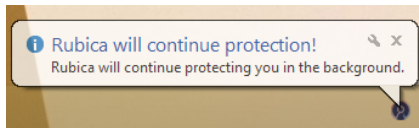
Click the Rubica icon to start protection.



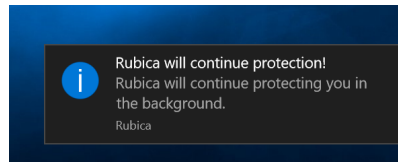
The VPN will establish a connection.
